Parklands Outdoor Adventure Summer Camp COVID-19 Safety Guidelines

At Parklands Outdoor Adventure Summer Camp, safety is our number one priority and this year is no different. In an effort to keep all of our campers, parents, and staff healthy and happy this have instituted new safety policies and procedures in accordance with state and local guidelines in an effort to slow the spread of COVID-19. In compliance with state guidelines, we will institute wellness screenings each day, abide by social distancing requirements, and increase disinfection and sanitation protocols for our staff and facility. Below is a list of policies that are observed during summer camp. Your child will be required to comply with all safety guidelines set forth by Parklands staff. For the safety of all of our campers and staff, if your camper is unable to comply with these guidelines, we reserve the right to send them home and cancel their registration without refund. Below is a list of our COVID-19 safety guidelines:

- Parents will be required to remain in their vehicles during pick up and drop off each day.
 - o Parklands staff will walk campers into the building each morning and out to their vehicle at the end of each day.
- Parklands staff will administer temperature and health screenings for every camper each morning
 with the parent/gurdian present. Parents will be required to answer all health assessment questions
 honestly and accurately.
- All Parklands staff will complete a daily health assessment and will be required to answer honestly and accurately.
- Campers and staff will be required to wear a mask while inside the PNC Achievement Center.
- Campers and staff will observe six feet of social distance between one another both indoors and outdoors
 - Parklands education staff will always prioritize immediate physical and emotional health and in certain situations will likely need to be closer than six feet to your camper to help them over logs, perform first aid, etc.
- Campers and staff will be asked to wash hands for at least 20 seconds regularly and always after sneezing, coughing, using the restroom, or touching/disinfecting surfaces
- Campers and staff will remain with their designated group all week
- Building facilities, frequently touched surfaces, and restrooms will be sanitized at least twice during the day and once overnight each day
- Camp supplies, toys, and equipment will be sanitized after each use
- Parklands staff will monitor and enforce proper social distancing, hand washing, and mask etiquette daily and will report any issues to parents if necessary.
- When a camper or staff member shows a fever or other contagious symptoms, the camper or staff
 member will be removed from the classroom immediately and placed in a safe, secluded area.
 Staff members will be sent home and the camper parent or guardian will be called to remove the
 camper from The Parklands within one hour.
- The Parklands of Floyds Fork will notify enrolled families and staff of a diagnosed case of COVID-19 in the program, while still protecting the privacy of the diagnosed individual.
