Dear Friends of The Parklands,



POPE LICK ARCHERY RANGE

No matter how you prefer to spend your time outside, The Parklands has something for everyone regardless of age or ability. Paved and natural trails for biking, hiking, walking, and running cut through the surrounding landscape; sprawling open areas for playing, relaxing, and gathering dot The Parklands map with playgrounds or spraygrounds for kids to let loose; Floyds Fork, ponds, and lakes provide a place for fishing and shady respite in the hot summers.

In the summer of 2022, we unveiled our latest project to bring people together at The Parklands. Because of the generosity of The Greg Davis Fund, we were able to build the Pope Lick Archery Range for all to enjoy. Our top-notch archery range offers 8 different targets between 10 and 50 yards for archers of all experience levels to enjoy. Since its opening in June 2022, the range has been used regularly by families, friends, and individuals looking to pick up a new hobby, brush up on an old one, or practice to master the skill. It has quickly become a popular Parklands amenity and opportunity for people to engage in exercise and the outdoors in a different way.

EDUCATION

THE PARKLANDS S.E.E.D PROGRAM

Through our field trip scholarship program, or S.E.E.D. Program (Stewardship, Education, Exploration, Discovery), we partner with local Title I schools and non-profit organizations to expose their students to new environments and activities. Each S.E.E.D partner receives a minimum of four interactions per year with our Parklands Education team, where they will hike, creek walk, fish, or play field games. This consistency fosters the connection between student and landscape by allowing students time to get to know nature on their own terms.

Our partnership with Neighborhood House highlights the power of program consistency. Each summer for the past five years, we have hosted Neighborhood House students weekly for eight weeks. When we began this partnership, we asked students what kind of wildlife we may see on the trail or in the stream. Shouts of “Tigers!”, “Lions!”, “Alligators!” echoed under the pavilion. Eventually, they moved to “Rabbits!”, “Deer!”, and finally, “Snakes!” Just uttering the word snake caused the group to recoil in horror. They wanted no part of the hike and creek walk planned because reptile danger lurked around every corner.

With nervous apprehension students began the walk toward the trail. The students started walking single file on the farthest side of the path from “the woods” where snakes were hiding. When the group arrived at Floyds Fork, Ranger Curtis explained that they would be wading in the stream looking for things like crawfish, turtles, fish, and even snakes. His comment was met with raised eyebrows and incredulous looks from the students. Noticing their anxiety, Ranger Curtis quelled their fears by stomping happily into the water and pulling out a crawfish. Slowly, students began inching toward the water until all of them were splashing and examining crawfish. Once the initial fear was gone the students spent the entire afternoon in the creek— culminating in catching a northern water snake.

Slowly, year over year, with consistency we have removed fear of the outdoors for our S.E.E.D partners. Each year, students grow more confident in themselves and more connected to the natural world. Their love of nature is not limited to The Parklands but has been fostered there so that they take that passion into their own community.

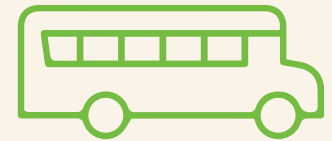

ENVIRONMENT

AMERICAN CHESTNUT RESTORATION PROJECT

The American chestnut (*Castanea dentata*) was once one of the most common and ecologically important trees in the eastern United States. However, a fungal blight introduced in the early 20th century devastated the species, killing an estimated 4 billion trees and drastically altering forest ecosystems.

Efforts to restore the American chestnut have been ongoing for decades, with various approaches including hybridization with blight-resistant Asian chestnut species and genetic engineering. Another such effort is the American Chestnut Restoration Project at The Parklands of Floyds Fork.

This Parklands project is funded through the Gibbs Foundation and includes two groves, one in Beckley Creek Park and one in Broad Run Park. As a Legacy Tree Sponsor of the American Chestnut Foundation, we receive around twenty-five “research” chestnut seeds per year. These seeds, along with any harvested from our two groves, are sent to Woody Warehouse in Lizton, Indiana. As one of the nation’s top growers of native trees from seed, they germinate the seeds and grow them into 5’-6’ trees. The Parklands then uses these trees to replace blighted chestnuts in the groves. Eventually, the goal is to reintroduce American chestnut trees back into Kentucky’s landscape.

This project is part of a broader effort by the American Chestnut Foundation, which seeks to restore the species to its former ecological prominence. While it remains to be seen whether these efforts will ultimately succeed, The Parklands continues to work hard towards this universal goal. The restoration of the American chestnut would have significant ecological and cultural implications, providing habitat and food for wildlife and returning a beloved and historically significant tree to eastern forests.

PARTNER SPOTLIGHT: **WOODY WAREHOUSE** NURSERY, INC.

Woody Warehouse Nursery, located in Lizton, Indiana, specializes in growing native trees, such as the American chestnut. The Parklands of Floyds Fork partners with Woody Warehouse to contract grow seeds from our American chestnut groves. The vast majority of trees Woody Warehouse cultivates are from seeds gathered by hand in the local region, like The Parklands, which ensures trees are adapted to our environment and, with good maintenance and care, continue to grow long after us. They then propagate these seeds in their greenhouse until they are a desirable size and can be sent back to The Parklands with the hopes of reintroducing this mighty tree back into the natural landscape.

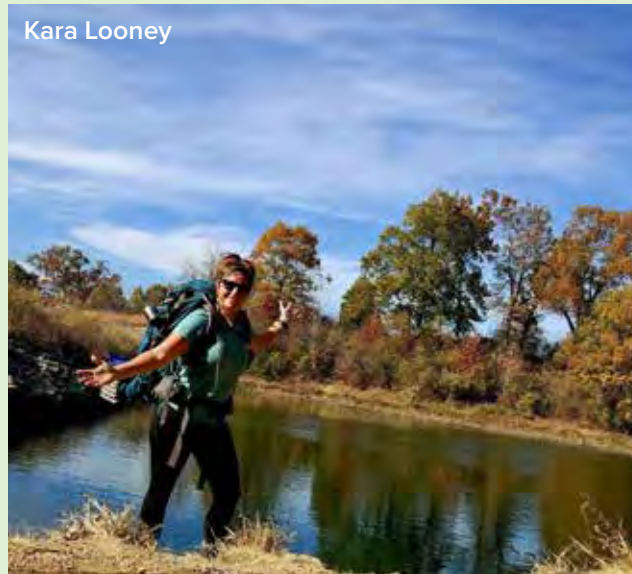
PARKLANDS MEMBERSHIP
